THE EPISCOPAL FUND — ¶818.1 - ¶818.12

- Committees on Episcopacy should have a working knowledge of the purpose of the "Episcopal Fund"
 - How the funds are raised
 - Intended use
 - What expenses are paid for bishops (salaries, housing, office expenses, travel expense reimbursements)
 - Benefits provided bishops (healthcare insurance, pensions)
 - Audit requirements for Episcopal Office

- Set by General Conference, apportioned to annual conferences and local churches, and distribution of the funds by GCFA ¶614.1b, ¶621, ¶805.6, ¶806.1a, ¶808, ¶810.1
