## **Evaluating INBRE: Putting evaluation processes and data to work**

## Presented by Laura Lessard, Laura Haas

**Description:** Evaluation processes to capture the reach and impact of INBREs have had to expand over time. Beyond support for the classic investigator-led research project, INBRE networks have been asked to expand their reach and their work with no increase in annual resources for the past 17 years. This session will explore strategies that use evaluation to drive program progress and decision making. We will start by learning about how internal and external evaluation needs are met by INBRE programs across the country. Then, evaluators from two states will share examples of novel evaluation use, including the following: • a cross-state project exploring the impact of INBRE funded summer undergraduate research programs, • using outcome data to strengthen student recruitment, • how evaluation-related activity itself can support programmatic priorities (eg, research collaboration, student engagement), and • how one INBRE is fostering research-supportive environments through structured institutional goal-setting. The presenters will engage the audience in sharing additional strategies they use for putting their evaluations to work.
