- -Describe one's vocational meaning in relation to purpose of mission within medicine.
- -Discuss the history of efficacy studies of progesterone in early pregnancy.
- -Discuss the safety of progesterone in early pregnancy.
- -Discuss current practice patterns of progesterone in early pregnancy.
- -Discuss uses and safety of progesterone use in 2nd and 3rd trimesters.
- -Discuss the safety and efficacy of progesterone use in context of recent abortion debates.
- -Describe the alarming increase in incidence of suicide, particularly in our youth.
- -List the root causes of the increasing incidence of suicide attempts.
- -Discuss how to effectively diagnose and treat suicidal attempts.
- -State why physicians are essential in initiating and leading effective education and prevention efforts of suicide.
- -Discuss current refugee and other displaced person statistics.

- -Describe the process of refugee resettlement and general health screening guidelines.
- -Identify unique health risks for immigrant pregnant women, including screening, diagnosis, and treatment options for rare conditions.
- -Discuss best practices for prenatal and postpartum care for immigrants.
- -Connect with medical, social, and material community resources.
- -Provide referrals for your patients.
- -Identify national organizations that offer training regarding key issues facing pregnant and parenting women and families.
- Describe the difference between risk avoidance and risk reduction approaches to sex education.
- Identify the components of the Optimal Health model to move sexually active teens away from risk.
- Assess the impact of ideological agendas and gender confusion on adolescent physical, emotional, and social development.
- Articulate the repudiation of Advantage Discrimination.
- -Identify barriers to patient care presented by corporate practice of medicine.
- -Define corporate practice of medicine and its foundations.
- -Describe the various arms of corporate medicine that we encounter.
- -Discuss the impact of corporate medicine on the integrity of medical care.
- -Describe why prenatal diagnoses can traumatize parents.
- -Discuss why fetal diagnosis is under-reported today and a roadblock to perinatal palliative care.
- -Identify how "lethal" language can creep into conversations regarding fetal diagnoses, including when the diagnosis may actually mean "imperfect", but not fatal.
- -Discuss the history of social science research on gender identity.
- -Describe the mechanisms by which social scientists altered the research narrative on understanding the human person as male or female.
- -Identify the processes that scientists capitalize on statistical methods (and media collaboration) to sow confusion about the same.
- -Describe the mechanisms of action of mifepristone and progesterone.
- -Discuss the competitive nature of the receptor binding.
- -Discuss objectively the reasoning behind the abortion-pill reversal and why a) it is a reversal and b) why it is a clinically reasonable procedure.
- -Describe the mechanism of action for chemical abortion and typical experience.
- -Identify deficiencies affecting abortion and maternal mortality data.
- -Describe complication frequency for abortion with pharmacologic agents.
- -Discuss the FDA's removal of safeguards.
- -Debate the ethics and procedure of abortion pill reversal.
- -Describe the inside-outside strategy that helps us advance conservative policies pertaining to healthcare and win key legislative fights.
- -Discuss how to build and maintain relationships with your lawmakers to make a difference in healthcare.
- -Describe the field of wellbeing studies and its relevance to bioethical issues like abortion, euthanasia, and gender-affirmation therapies.
- -Describe the framework for human flourishing developed in the work of Professor Tyler VanderWeele. -Explore novel ways of thinking about flourishing in early and later life that challenge the assumptions underpinning campaigns for legal abortion and euthanasia.
- Review research regarding the parent experience of a prenatal diagnosis.
- -Provide guidance for a parent-centered response.
- -Identify additional resources needed to meet the needs of this population of parents.
- -Describe the epidemiology of maternal mortality.
- -Define the risk factors in the etiologic pathway for maternal mortality, including racial-ethnic differences.
- -Articulate rational clinical, policy and research approaches to address maternal mortality, especially in minority women.
