



Customs Act

Article 53:

For the purpose of supervision of the regulation implementation of concerning prohibition and restriction, government agencies that the determine the provisions on prohibition and/or restriction certain import or export shall notify Minister.

WASTE IMPORT REGULATION

Hazardous Waste Category: Waste of primary cells, batteries and electric accumulators, Radioactive residues, Other slag and ash from the manufacture of iron or steel

NON-HAZARDOUS WASTE




Non-Hazardous Waste Category : Paper, Metal, Plastic, Rubber, Textile, Glass

Only for industrial purposes with criteria:

- 1. Non landfill activities
- 2. Non trash/garbage and not mixed with it
- Not contaminated with hazardous material and hazardous waste
- 4. Homogenous **Permission requirement**:
- Import License
- Import Approval
- Surveyor Report
- etc



NATIONAL EXPERIENCES







In 2019 NHI Co. imported 1.122 containers declared as Plastic Waste (Non-Hazardous Waste), but in fact, has contaminated with Hazardous Waste



Detained by Customs by using Risk Assessment and Intelligence. Special Task Force led by Ministry of Environment and Forestry was employed for further handling processes



540 Containers have been destructed in 2021



Remaining 582 Containers were waiting for completion of cost expense by the company, for further destruction process



Take Back procedure not working



Verification in Exporting Countries does not comply with the applicable regulation



Together with exporting countries and the Basel Convention Secretariat to promote legal trans-boundary trade/movement of plastic waste





NATIONAL EXPERIENCES





In Januari 2021, J Co. imported 1 container consisting 525 plastic gloves declared as new Nitrile Glove Non-Medical



During physical examination, the goods were recognized as used goods mixed with garbage, and the company were then identified not to be having Waste Import License



Handed over to the Ministry of Environment and Forestry for further completion, either by re-exported or destructed mechanism.

NATIONAL EXPERIENCES







In Februari 2021, the suspects, CS dan FS brought 550 sacks of illegal waste of medical equipment in form of used gloves.



Modus: by using wooden vessel through Riau Island waters



Handed over to the Ministry of Environment and Forestry for further completion, either by re-exported or destructed mechanism.

EXTRA EFFORT – ENHANCING CUSTOMS ROLE

"Indonesia aims to cut marine plastic waste by 70% within five years (2025), by 2040 Indonesia plans to be entirely plastic pollution-free "



Established Sub-Directorate of Transnational Crime that focuses on handling transnational crimes (including supervision of trade in plastic waste – Green Customs initiative)



Initiating an MoU with the Ministry of Environment and Forestry to strengthen supervision on environmental crimes



Strengthening the role of DGCE in the HAZARDOUS WASTE IMPORT TASK FORCE which has been fostered and continues its work since 2009



Enhance the risk management system to intervene the importation of waste violations



Improve coordination with customs institutions of other countries and engage in operations on a global or international scale
