A new professional standard


PS#2: Promote and embed education for sustainable development (ESD) across learning and working practices.¹




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ESD empowers learners to take informed decisions and responsible actions for environmental integrity, economic viability and just society, for present and future generations, while respecting cultural diversity. It is about lifelong learning, and is an integral part of quality education.

What this looks like in practice for educators



Early Career Teacher (I do)

Understand the value of educational for sustainable development (ESD) and communicate its importance to your learners, inside and outside the classroom.

Experienced Teacher (I share)

Model sustainable practices at work and collaborate with others to develop and embed ESD approaches that build learners' sustainability knowledge, skills and behaviours.


Advanced Teacher (I influence)

Champion a whole-organisation approach to ESD with peers and external partners by helping them promote, research and embed good ESD practice.

The current Individualised Learner Record (ILR) shows 3,466,069 enrolments on 10,815 different qualifications.

Just 1.5% of qualifications (160) account for half of all enrolments nationally and all of these were included in the audit.




Around 3% of all FE learners are enrolled on qualifications with some ESD or 'green skills' content (116,833 out of 3,466,069)

Around 0.5% of all FE learners are enrolled on qualifications with significant ESD content (18,474 out of 3,466,069)

9 out of 10 of those are studying Geography or Environmental Science (17,462 out of 18,474)




