

Reproductive justice: Monica McLemore

- Public health and staff nurse, now tenured associate professor at University of California, San Francisco as a

- Research across reproductive spectrum including abortion, birth, cancer risk, contraception, family planning, and healthy sexuality, pleasure, and consent
- Combining nursing, public health, and policy research using community engaged and embedded methods to develop programs to test and deliver interventions.
- Translation of work to the public using social media and science communication as well as open data for public scholarship and authentic community engagement.
