
If you can hear YouTube videos or music on your computer, then you have audio output. You can adjust the volume of your computer by clicking on the Speaker icon.

Web Events, Webinars, Web Meetings-what's the difference?


Webinar

The word webinar is combination of web + seminar. A webinar is a seminar, lecture, presentation, or event that happens on the web. Usually webinars are educational. When you attend a webinar, you will be able to see and hear the panelists who are talking and teaching. This is why you need a computer with audio/speakers. You don't need a webcam or a microphone for a webinar.

Webinar features may include ways to interact with panelists. For example, you can:

- Use icons to raise or lower the volume
- Use icons to react and raise your hand
- Post messages in the chat box
- Ask questions in the Q&A box


Not all these features are the same in every webinar. Sometimes you can ask questions that everyone can see, and sometimes your questions will only be seen by the panelists. This degree of interaction is determined when the webinar is created. Sometimes it could be distracting or violate privacy laws if everyone can see every question. This is particularly important in healthcare because HIPPA privacy laws need to be observed for your protection.



Web Meeting

Web meeting or web conference is a more interactive type of webinar. A web meeting is like attending a meeting on the web. You can see and hear others and they can see and hear you. To get the most out of a web meeting you need a computer with a microphone and webcam. These will allow you to be seen and heard.

Web meetings usually have a few more features than a webinar. In a web meeting, you can decide to be seen or you can decide to be off camera. You can decide to be heard or you can decide to mute yourself so others can't hear you.
