 - Pharmacy dispensing: Epic Willow Ambulatory




Current Clinical Model

Retail Team

- 2 FTE and 1 PTE staff pharmacist
- 2 FTE technicians
- 5 FTE prior authorization technicians (PAT)
 - Each technician designated to a specific specialty





Clinical Team

5 FTE clinical pharmacists

- Gastroenterology/hepatology
- Endocrine
- Transplant
- Dermatology/allergy
- Rheumatology/neurology



Timeline of UTMB Specialty Pharmacy




BPA: best practice advisory pop-up in system

Retail Team Responsibilities



Additional responsibilities:

- Counsel new patients in specialty areas not currently covered by clinical pharmacist team
- Coordinate care and specialty drug access for patients
- Monthly refill call management
- Mail order delivery



P2P: peer-to-peer

Clarification of Specialty Meds

High cost, complex (often requires prior authorizations), and/or requires special handling


Examples

- Hepatitis C medications (e.g., MAVYRET, EPCLUSA)
- Oral oncology medications (e.g., VERZENIO, ZYTIGA)
- Immunosuppressive biologics (e.g., COSENTYX, SKYRIZI)
- Gastrointestinal medications (e.g., MOVANTIK, XIFAXAN)
- Transplant medications (e.g., ENVARSUS, CRESEMBA)



Specialty Pharmacy Growth


UTMB Specialty Pharmacy Growth Year over Year


Additional duties

UF Health Jacksonville

UF Health academic health center

- 5 not-for-profit medical centers in Jacksonville, Gainesville, and Central Florida
- Colleges of Dentistry, Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy, Public Health and Health Professions, and Veterinary Medicine

UF Health Jacksonville

- Private, not-for-profit hospital affiliated with the University of Florida
 - 695-beds including UF Health Jacksonville North
- Department of Pharmacy
 - Approximately 200 FTEs
 - Inpatient, ambulatory/specialty, central, therapeutic policy (i.e., drug information center)
 - 80% of pharmacists are board certified



Ambulatory and Specialty Pharmacy Model

- One ambulatory pharmacy for UF Health Jacksonville—340B entity
- Specialty pharmacy operates within retail space/same NPI
- Systems: medical record = Epic (custom-made specialty documentation), pharmacy dispensing = Epic Willow Ambulatory (previously EnterpriseRx)
- FTEs
 - Manager, Ambulatory Care and Specialty Pharmacy Services
 - Supervisor, Ambulatory and Specialty
 - 2 pharmacy analysts

Ambulatory (Retail)

- Pharmacists
 - 4 core pharmacists
 - 10 clinical pharmacists in primary care/specialized clinics
- Technicians: 18

Specialty Pharmacy

- **Pharmacists:** 6 clinical pharmacists blended in specialty clinics
- Technicians: 3 specialty technicians dedicated to Patient Management Program

- Embedded pharmacists in hepatology, gastroenterology, neurology, pulmonology, and rheumatology
 - Cross coverage in all clinics
- Pharmacist liaison in dermatology
- Pharmacist collaboration with oncology pharmacists (part of inpatient operations)
- All specialty clinical pharmacists: Initiations, reassessments, clinical questions
- Centralized specialty pharmacy technicians (calls, refills, delivery coordination)

Specialty Medication—Definition


Patient Management Program (PMP) only

- List of medications within accredited programs
 - Hepatology
 - Gastroenterology
 - Neurology
 - Oncology
 - Pulmonology
 - Rheumatology
- Specialty Medication Management subcommittee
 - Monthly meetings to discuss medication access and assess medication list for modifications
- Non-PMP medications are encompassed within the retail pharmacy

2020	163,161	0.77%

Call Statistics

- 0.9% average abandonment rate
- 94.6% answered within 30 seconds or less



Satisfaction Surveys

- 100% of patients rated overall experience as "Excellent"
- 100% of prescribers rated overall patient service experience as a 4 or 5 (on 5-point scale)



Financial Benefit

- Zero payer audit takebacks on specialty medications
- Over \$1 million provided in copay assistance



Outcomes

- 96% of patients have ≥80% adherence rate
- 99% of patients agree that PMP has improved healthrelated quality of life
- 1.4-day average turnaround time

UAB Specialty/Retail Pharmacy Services

Two outpatient retail pharmacies providing care for SPS

Systems in use:

- Electronic medical records—Cerner
- Clinical data system—Therigy
- Pharmacy dispensing—EnterpriseRx

Total FTEs—127

- Specialty
 - -Pharmacists—34
 - -Patient care coordinators (PCCs)—40
- Retail
 - -Pharmacists—18
 - -Technicians—35



UAB SPS Practice Model

Two business offices: each connects to a retail pharmacy and allows for SPS operations

SPS staff: dedicated to specific disease states with pharmacists integrated into the clinics

Clinical pharmacist services:

- Patient education
- Side effect mitigation and management
- Clinical assessments and reassessments
- 24/7 availability for clinical questions
- Payor appeals
- Peer-to-peer assistance




