Abstract Content

- Structure is as follows:
 - o Submission Topic (see description below)
 - o Abstract number (will be assigned automatically)
 - o Abstract title
 - o Author names* First name(s) and last name(s) (do not add titles)
 - o Author affiliations* including country, of each author. Author affiliations should be indicated by superscript numbers, e.g. Felix Moran¹, Jim Bradley²
 ¹University of Ulster, N. Ireland; ²Belfast City Hospital, N. Ireland.
 - o Content (max. 250 words, excluding abstract title)

The abstract content should be structured using the following headings:

- For original work: Background, Aims, Methods/Techniques, Results/Outcome, Conclusions
- For case reports: Background, Case History, Conclusions
- o Keywords (max. 5 words)

Figures & Tables

- Any abbreviations should be defined where first mentioned
- We accept the following figure formats: .jpg, .jpeg, .png
- Figures will be published as per the resolution of the figure provided (minimum 300 dpi is recommended)
- Regardless of whether figures are submitted in colour or mono, figures will be printed in
- Figure and Table legends should be editable and appear in the abstract text under the figure/ table.

Therefore, accept the licence during the abstract submission process on the platform (this is mandatory).

Notification of accepted Abstracts and poster presentations

- Abstracts will be reviewed by the review committee. All abstracts approved by the review
 committee are accepted for the poster exhibition on site in Strasbourg and will be published
 in a supplement of the Journal of Neurology, Neurosurgery and Psychiatry (JNNP). You will
 be notified early July whether your abstract has been accepted for publication or not.
