Harvest 2022 Harvest Recap

- Tale of two harvests, with a heat spike in between
- The crop looked light headed into harvest, and quality was very strong
- Then the heat came...along with panipicks and delays
- Early varieties were fine
- Cabernet Sauvignon came all at once
- Ultimately, quality turned out better than expected
- However, volumes were significantly down
 - Central Coast AVA (Districts 7 & 8) down over 23%

Central Coast Bulk Market an overview

- Central Coast bulk wine pricing is moderate to strong, with supply balanced or short (depending on the variety).
- Wines of exceptional quality are in high demand
 - Cabernet Sauvignon
 - Dark Red Blenders
 - Coolclimate Syrah
 - Premium sub-AVA Pinot Noir and Chardonnay
- Not all bulk wines are created equal. Bulk wine buyers are increasingly relying on lab analyses, and looking for wines that compliment or improve blends, as opposed to just stretch volume.



Cabernet Sauvignon

- Demand is moderate for Cabernet Sauvignon, but quality is imperative.
 - Quality is often based on quantitative measures, more so than qualitative
- Buyers focused mainly on Paso Robles, with Monterey/Santa Barbara Cab Sauv buyers primarily using those AVA's for premium CA blends.
- Strongest Paso demand is from Paso wineries; larger CA wineries are also in the market, but non-Paso programs do not always pay comparable prices.
- Paso is Cab heavy, and there is a shortage of the Cab that buyers often prefer.

Chardonnay

- Prices are strong for Central Coast Chardonnay, especially within salvA's.
- Supply is short for premium, cooklimate regions, especially SLH, SRH, SMV, and Edna Valley.
- Much of the traditional Chardonnay acreage within the Central Coast is being redeveloped.
 - Chardonnay is currently one of top two varieties of grapevine nursery orders
- Paso is a strong option for Central Coast buyers that need stylistic and price diversification

Sauvignon Blanc

- Sauvignon Blanc has been the most indemand variety within the Central Coast from vintage 2021.
- Pricing is very high, but not unsustainable.
- For 2021 bulk wine, the average price of Central Coast Sauvignon Blanc exceeded the average price of 2021 Paso Cabernet Sauvignon.
- The cure for high prices is high prices
 - Most vines currently on order with grapevine nurseries are Sauvignon Blanc

Pinot Noir

- Supply is still long, but getting closer to balanced, with stronger interest and earlier commitment in 2023.
- Central Coast Pinot Noir is still struggling with brands trading to CA AVA.
- Supply is short for premium, cooklimate regions, especially SLH, SRH, SMV, and Edna Valley.
- Much of the existing Pinot Noir acreage within the Central Coast is being redeveloped.

Red Blenders-BDX

- With the market push towards Cabernet Sauvignon, much of the red blender acreage disappeared
- Bordeaux varietal blenders in highdemand
 - Petit Verdot and sometimes Malbec are used to add color to Cabernet Sauvignon
 - Merlot and Cabernet Franc bring volume and complexity
 - High-quality Bordeaux blenders not always attainable within
 Paso Robles, so winemakers are searching other AVA's to blend in minimal quantities

Red Blenders-Rhone Reds + Petite Sirah

- Dark red, high quality Petite Sirah and Syrah are very limited in availability
 - Very little volume of either are currently available
- The market for other Rhone reds (Grenache, Mourvedre, and others) is bifurcated along multiple lines.
 - Red vs. Rosè
 - Westside vs. Eastside (Paso)
