

ASHP Surveys of Health-System Specialty Pharmacy Practice



ASHP National Survey of Health-System Specialty Pharmacy Practice—2020

- Published in AJHP in October 2021
- The first of its kind as a national survey of health system specialty pharmacy services



ASHP Survey of Health-System Specialty Pharmacy Practice: Clinical Services— 2022

- Expands data on integrated advanced practice model of hospital and health system specialty pharmacy practice models
- Focused solely on the clinical services component



ASHP Survey of Health-System Specialty Pharmacy Practice Models, Operations, Workforce—2022

- Work is ongoing
- Survey open period September– November 2022
- New areas of focus include innovative technology use, environmentally friendly initiatives, and LDDs





Trends in Multi-Hospital Health System Organizational Structure





Multi-Hospital Health System ASHP Multi-Hospital Health System Organizational Structure Survey—2022 Pharmacy Organizational Structure








Multi-Hospital Health Systems CSSF

Treatment monitoring

Specialty pharmacist actions and interactions that occur while a patient is actively on therapy

Pre-treatment

All specialty pharmacist actions and interactions that occur prior to treatment selection and/or initiation of therapy



Continuity of care services

Supportive health system practices that enhance a HSSP's ability to care for specialty patients longitudinally and holistically



Treatment initiation

All activities the specialty pharmacy performs to enable patients to safely start the most effective and appropriate specialty treatment option




Education and research

Any combination of new HSSP employment requirements and/or onboarding experience, HSSP staff involvement in training pharmacy and/or medical residents, or providing continuing education to clinic staff



Specialty Pharmacy Model (n = 127)



HSSP Services

>50% provided to ALL patients

- Financial assistance enrollment (77%)
- Free drug program management (71%)
- PA completion assistance (84%)
- PA denial assistance (80%)
- Specialty medication selection and/or recommendation (69%)
- Pre-treatment initiation disease state assessment (57%)
- Initial patient education (52%)

>50% provided to HSSP patients only (% provided to all)

- Adherence support (27%)
- Disease state and/or lab monitoring (36%)
- Immunization screening and/or admin (34%)
- Individualized patient care plan (34%)
- Injection training (48%)
- Ongoing patient education (32%)
- Patient visits with clinic-embedded pharmacists (48%)
- Refill reminders (18%)
- Transitions of care coordination (42%)
- Treatment monitoring for medication safety/ effectiveness (34%)
- REMS management (19%)
- Non-specialty medication management (25% all; 36% do not provide)






Transition of care coordination by HSSPs (N = 85)

Episodes of Care	n	%
Between different specialty or retail pharmacies	67	79%
Between insurance coverage/plan changes	67	79%
Between sites of care (e.g., inpatient to outpatient)	67	79%
Between different medication administration modalities (e.g., infusion to oral)	57	67%
Between multiple health care prescribers (e.g., specialty, primary care, psychology)	53	62%
Between pediatric and adult care	19	22%

Survey Development— Practice Models, Operations, Workforce 2022


An advisory panel consisting of nine specialty pharmacy leaders from diverse geographic locations met three times to review the 2020 survey instrument and propose revisions for the 2022 survey.

Major changes included:

- Addition of a technology matrix item to evaluate innovative technology use by HSSPs
- Addition of a "green initiatives" question
- Removal of all clinical questions
- Addition of new questions on technician and pharmacist roles and responsibilities
- Addition of new questions on limited distribution drug (LDD) management


