

You don't need to go all in. Find what you like about Agile implement those. Here are 7 ideas:

- 1. Sprint planning meetings with the product owner and team members
- 2. Daily scrum is limited to 15 minutes
- 3. Sprint review discusses completed and incomplete tasks
- 4. Sprint retrospective, or lessons learned, at the end of each sprint
- 5. Project Task Boards (Post-it Notes)
- 6. Project task boards remain in an open and accessible area
- 7. Sprints are less than 4 weeks with the same team
- 1. Sprint Planning Meeting (Scope Meeting & the Project TaskBoard)
